Operation Rocky Top Rescue

Following a comprehensive two-day collaborative effort in Knoxville, eleven missing children from Knox County have been successfully located. Dubbed Operation Rocky Top Rescue, this initiative was a joint endeavor involving the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, the Knox County Sheriff's Office, the Knoxville Police Department, and the Department of Children's Services - Absconder Unit.

In the lead-up to the operation, intelligence analysts and detectives meticulously identified numerous juveniles reported as missing or unaccounted for in the Knoxville area. Before the operation began, sixteen of these children were already located. Over the course of April 10th and 11th, five teams embarked on a mission to locate an additional 25 missing juveniles. Of these, eleven juveniles, aged between 14 and 17 years, previously categorized as missing, delinquent, or runaways, were successfully located and are now safe.

In the following weeks, these agencies will continue in their efforts to locate those children who remain unaccounted for following the operation.


